



The **2024** European Parliament Elections: A Defining Moment for the EU's Future Path

The 2024 European Parliament elections, set between 06 - 09 Jun 2024 are a pivotal event with 373 million eligible voters determining the allocation of 705 seats. Key issues include climate change, economic resilience, migration, and EU stability. Proportional representation ensures every vote counts, and voter turnout is expected to exceed the 50.7% seen in 2019.

The rise of far-right parties, gaining traction in countries like Germany, Ital<u>y</u>, and France, could significantly transform the European Parliament. These parties, known for their nationalist and anti-EU rhetoric, resonate with voters influenced by current political and economic conditions. Their electoral success could lead to substantial changes in EU policies, particularly regarding immigration and environmental regulations.

Post-election, coalition formation and the election of the European Commission President will be critical. Ursula von der Leyen's re-election bid amidst this politically charged atmosphere will be significant, as the new parliamentary makeup will decisively shape the EU's policy agenda for the next five years.

There is growing concern about political violence, particularly in Germany, which reported 3,691 incidents in 2023. Similar tensions have surfaced during elections in Slovakia, where Prime Minister Robert Fico faced an assassination attempt. France, Poland, and the Netherlands have also seen increases in violence against political figures, though these incidents are generally less linked to the extreme right compared to those in Germany.

Since early 2024, Europe has experienced widespread protests, particularly in the agricultural sector. Farmers in Germany, France, and Poland have protested against EU policies and international trade dynamics affecting local farming economies.

In this charged political climate, issues like the rise of far-right parties and increased political violence could significantly impact voter behavior in the ongoing European Parliament elections. The widespread protests against EU policies add to the heightened political tension, potentially influencing the electoral process more than in previous years.
